RBC Proposal Explained

How Automatic Delegates Vote on Presidential Roll Call

The RBC's proposed change to implement the recommendations on unpledged delegates (actual language is included in Article IX.C.7 of the proposed Call for the 2020 Convention) provides that on the first presidential roll call vote, automatic delegates will vote only if a presidential candidate has secured enough pledged delegates to receive the nomination. Otherwise, only pledged delegates will vote on the first presidential roll call. If there is a second presidential roll call, all delegates, including automatic delegates, will vote.

Automatic delegates will continue to be able to vote on all other convention matters including the standing committee reports (Credentials, Rules and Platform) and the vice-presidential nomination. They will also continue to have access to all convention assets as they did in 2016 and will see no change to their access on the floor or to housing.

When Can Automatic Delegates Vote on the First Ballot?

Under the new system, automatic delegates will only cast votes on the first presidential nominating ballot if a presidential candidate has secured more than enough pledged delegate certifications to secure the nomination. The determination that automatic delegates are eligible to participate on the first ballot will be made by the DNC Secretary based on the pledged delegate certifications submitted prior to the Convention.

How Many Delegate Votes Does a Candidate Need to Secure the Nomination?

The number of votes needed to secure the nomination remains unchanged -- a majority of those eligible to vote on that ballot.
